The children have commenced a new school year. SOH have supplied funds for school books and equipment. Wagin Primary School students raised funds to provide new uniforms for the children which was very much appreciated. A new teaching assistant has been employed to assist Puthea in the classroom.

Mesang Agriculture Project

The first rice harvest has been gathered. Plans to build 10 small houses for the HIV ladies who live in this village are underway and will soon be completed. There are also plans to construct a storage shed and a roadway to provide accessibility for the building materials and produce.

2014 SOH Team Trip

The next SOH Team trip is planned for November this year and there are already several people who have indicated that they wish to come along. We take a maximum of 10 people as a group of this size can easily be transported to the SOH projects by bus and we have found that a group of ten works very well.
